

GET TO KNOW LOS LAREDOS

GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE REGION

It is of utmost importance to consider and learn a bit about the history of this significant border strip, population data, geographical conditions, as well as the port infrastructure. These aspects reflect competitiveness and also showcase to the world the bilateral relationship that exists and the collaborative efforts for the development of both cities.

HISTORY OF "LOS LAREDOS"

On May 15, 1755, Captain Tomas Sanchez founded San Agustin de Laredo, on the left hand margin of the Rio Grande, in what today is the center of a dynamic region that is recognized for its international trade leadership, as well as for the competitiveness of its businesses, organizations and individuals.

The "Sister Cities" of Laredo, and Nuevo Laredo, the first one in Texas, in the United States, and the latter in Tamaulipas, Mexico, are also recognized either as "Los Dos Laredos" or as the "Laredo Region". In both sides of the river that divides but also joins these two great nations, more than 650 thousand persons live and work, many of them in the international trade sector, which is the main economic activity that has made the Nuevo Laredo Customs Port the most important in Mexico. On the U.S. side, this leadership, experience and drive is the reason the Laredo Customs District is number 3 in all of the United States, only behind Los Angeles and New York.

As a consequence of the Guadalupe-Hidalgo accord, subscribed in 1848 after the U.S.-Mexico war ended, the Rio Grande was determined to become the dividing borderline between both nations. When faced with this new reality, a group of families that decided that they wanted to continue being Mexicans, crossed the river and founded what now is Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, on the 15th day of June of 1848.

HISTORY OF THE CUSTOMS

Throughout history, the strategic location of Los Dos Laredos has favored the international exchange of merchandise and goods between the north and the south. That was the main reason why the Nuevo Laredo Custom Port was created on August 26, 1855, only seven years after the founding of the city. This brought official recognition and legal stability to trade between both nations through these sister cities.



When the railroads arrived, in 1881, economic and population substantially grew. Before two U.S. railroads connected Laredo, Texas with San Antonio and Corpus Christi, and the Mexican one connected Nuevo Laredo with Monterrey and from there on to Mexico City, merchandises used to cross by ferry. That same year, 1881, the first international railroad bridge that linked Los Dos Laredos was built and this allowed formal consular and trade actions between both nations.


As time flew by, both Laredos continued to grow, in an interdependent and sisterly way. The brotherhood between people was strengthened by families who had members on both sides of the river, something that still today is very frequent.

If we add to this the positive impact that international trade has always had on these communities, we see one of the main reasons of a sustained growth in population, economic strength, competitiveness and shared vision.

Los Dos Laredos once and again have showed how collaboration generates results. This has been demonstrated from the design and development of technological based custom procedures and software, which provided security and certainty to international trade operations, to the joint construction of bridges and customs installations that are an example of efficiency, safety and success for international trade.

At the Laredo Region there is a clear knowledge that it is important to prepare for the future, so both communities can work together to overcome challenges and to achieve shared goals. That is why in 2008 the "Plan de Gran Vision para la Reigon Laredo 2040" (Laredo Region Long-Term Vision Plan 2040) was developed. Later on, in 2016 it was updated for the City of Nuevo Laredo, while on the U.S. side the City of Laredo, Texas developed and approved it "Laredo Comprehensive Plan" in 2017.

Both Plans were developed with the participation of thousands of citizens, specialists, academics, representatives of private organizations and also of public servants. The objectives stressed the importance of aligning economic growth and development with an improvement of the quality of life for all its citizens, with eyes set on the shared future of the region, but without ever forgetting the shared past that forged this region.



GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION OF THE REGION

Los Laredos is located between 27° 50′ and 02″ North latitude and 99° 50′ 27″ West longitude. The elevations in the region range from 100 meters above sea level (masl) in the southeast on the right bank of the Rio Grande to 250 masl in the western part.

Altitudes along the riverbank are recorded at 110 masl, and approximately 70% of the region is situated between 120 and 130 masl, with the maximum height reaching 150 masl.

HYDROGRAPHY, TOPOGRAPHY, AND CLIMATE:

The Rio Grande or Rio Bravo is the main water source for the region and has two significant tributaries: El Coyote to the south and Las Alazanas to the northwest. A notable geographical feature of Laredo, Texas, is Lake Casa Blanca in the Lake Casa Blanca State Park.

The region is part of what physiographically is called the North American Great Plains Province, characterized by extensive plains interrupted by scattered low hills with gentle slopes, predominantly consisting of conglomerate material. It has a semi-flat relief with no significant heights or depressions.


According to climate classification, "Los Laredos" are in a region with a steppe-like dry climate, exhibiting some conditions typical of the steppe as a natural region. It is characterized as dry and extreme, with significant temperature fluctuations ranging from -3°C in winter to 46°C in summer.

August experiences the highest temperatures, while January is the coldest month. The average annual rainfall is 472.5 mm³, and the predominant winds come from the south.

DEMOGRAPHY OF NUEVO LAREDO, TAMAULIPAS.



POPULATION PYRAMID OF NUEVO LAREDO


This population pyramid of Nuevo Laredo shows that in 2020, the population under 15 years old represented 26.38% of the total; those in working age constituted 63.72%; and the elderly population, 9.9%.

Nuevo Laredo is known as a region of opportunities. In the year 2020, around 29% of the population were born in another state. Among that percentage, the three states that stand out are Veracruz (23.68%), San Luis Potosí (15.64%), and Coahuila (11.95%).

INTERNATIONAL BRIDGES OF THE REGION

"Los Laredos" has a privileged port infrastructure, boasting strategically located five international bridges. It is also referred to as the "Most important Customs and Logistics Platform in America."

Puerta de las Américas International Bridge (Bridge I): This bridge is primarily for pedestrian use and has four vehicular lanes. It connects Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, with Laredo, Texas, in its central area. It is also known as International Bridge I.


Juárez-Lincoln International Bridge (Bridge II): This bridge is for the crossing of light vehicles and connects Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, with Laredo, Texas. It is operated by the city of Laredo and the Secretariat of Communications and Transportation of Mexico. It is also known as International Bridge II.

World Trade International Bridge: Dedicated exclusively to cargo transport vehicles, it is the region's most valuable material asset. This structure is equipped with the most modern and significant infrastructure for conducting foreign trade operations in Latin America.

Solidaridad - Colombia International Bridge: Located in the municipality of Anáhuac, Nuevo León, it is one of the four international vehicle bridges situated on the border between the United States and Mexico in the city of Laredo, Texas.

Railway Operations Bridge: The Laredo-Nuevo Laredo railway bridge is located between the states of Tamaulipas in Mexico and Texas in the United States. Built in 1881, it accommodates the daily crossing of over 1,800 railway cars.



COMPETITIVE ADVANTAGES

Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas, and Laredo, Texas, are two border cities that, beyond being divided by the Rio Bravo, have collaborated for the development, always respecting official diplomatic channels. This collaboration reflects not only the growth of the region but also includes actions that enhance competitiveness and strengthen the bonds that unite Mexico and the United States.

LAREDOS REGION INFLUENCE CIRCLE OF "LOS LAREDOS" REGION

Historically and geographically, our "Laredos Region" has been strategic and fundamental to the North American economy.

To visualize this importance in a simple way, let's imagine placing the point of a compass in "Los Dos Laredos" and then opening it 500 kilometers (310 miles). This area (as we see in the attached illustration) is located in southern Texas, two-thirds of Tamaulipas, and the entire states of Coahuila and Nuevo León.

In this region we find more than 21 million people, as well as vast energy and mineral wealth; air, sea and land ports industrial, commercial, agricultural and research and development centers, world-class companies expert in logistics and global trade; banking specialized in foreign trade and the energy sector; world-class universities, hospitals and tourist destinations; competitive and competent human resources, as well as a stable climate and closeness to the rest of North America and the world.

The productive sectors of these four large and important states are located in this region of influence, whose central node is the "Laredos Region".

This "Circle of Influence" concept was originally developed in 2014 by María Eugenia Calderón-Porter, Vice President of the Office of Global Initiatives / Binational Center of Texas A&M International University. The focus of this concept is to be able to observe the diversity of high-level professional skills in that region. If the measure of this space is taken and applied to any other headquarters in the world, it will be difficult to find the same diversity of services, specialized human resources and experience in logistics.

Since then the circle has been used repeatedly around the world to symbolize the importance of the "Laredos Region", as well as the great competitiveness, capacity and talent of its people, companies and organizations.


URBAN COMPETITIVENESS INDEX 2022

Every two years, El Instituto Mexicano para la Competitividad A.C. (IMCO) conducts an evaluation of various indicators. In this study, a total of 69 cities/metropolitan areas were assessed, dividing them by the population living in these cities.

Nuevo Laredo is within the group of 250 to 500 thousand inhabitants, and the following results were obtained:

Laredo is the No. 1 inland port in the United States with over **294 billion dollars** in international trade operations.

We have the best geographical location, connecting the two most industrialized and commercial nations, Mexico and the United States, **as more than 40%** of the trade between Mexico and the United States is conducted through this region.

GOVERNMENT INCENTIVES IN LAREDO, TEXAS

According to the foundational focus on economic development, agreements will not be restricted to any particular type of industry. However, preference will be given to manufacturing (maquila) and any other industry that provides relatively higher wages.

Hospitality, tourism, and commerce will only be considered if the Municipal Council determines that the project will make a unique and unparalleled contribution to the economy and is expected to generate at least \$10 million in Added Value to real estate and 10 new permanent full-time jobs.

LIVING WAGE REQUIREMENT

To count as a permanent full-time job under this tax reduction program, the job must pay employee wages at a minimum level that is equal to two dollars (\$2.00) above the current U.S. minimum wage at the time of the agreement. Additional compensation, such as commissions and mileage, will be taken into consideration and included in the wages. However, overtime hours will not be considered.

Incentives may include:

- •City of Laredo fee exemption permit
- Accelerated Permitting
- •Neighborhood Empowerment Zones

Additionally, workforce incentive programs are available through various local initiatives that provide initiatives such as customized training, grants, and tax incentives for employers.


ECONOMIC STATISTICS OF "LOS LAREDOS"

Both Laredos continue to generate economic certainty and a climate of confidence that drives investment, and this is reflected in the data showing consistent job creation.

According to figures from the Instituto Mexicano del Seguro Social (IMSS) as of December 2022, the city of Nuevo Laredo had a total of 105,307 registered contributors, representing an increase of 4,226 contributions, or 4.18% more than in 2021 when there were 101,081 registrations.


IMSS Employment December 2021-December 2022


As can be seen, the economic activity that concentrates the highest number of contributors is the manufacturing industry, accounting for 36.08%, which corresponds to 37,999 employees.




AVERAGE EMPLOYMENT IN THE CITY OF LAREDO, TEXAS, PER QUARTER FROM 2010 TO 2022.



AVERAGE UNEMPLOYED PERSONS PER QUARTER 2019-2022








TOTAL GROSS PRODUCTION OF NUEVO LAREDO






GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT OF LAREDO, TEXAS





FOREIGN TRADE OF THE REGION

The importance of "Los Laredos" lies in the quality services related to international trade, primarily in its commercial activity and geographic location, complemented by the competitiveness of the customs and transportation sectors in the region.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE FOREIGN TRADE INFRASTRUCTURE AND COMPETITIVENESS

WORLD TRADE BRIDGE

Since its opening on April 15, 2000, until December 2021, there have been more than 46 million crossings between imports and exports.

Currently, there is an average of 14,000 daily crossings between exports and imports. The average utilized capacity is 60%.


With the crossing trend since the opening of this commercial port in April 2000, a 5.5% annual growth is estimated in the next 10 years.

The approximate figures would be 8,060 import crossings and 7,790 export crossings, resulting in a total of 15,850 daily crossings by 2025.

Mexico has 19 ports on the northern border, among which Nuevo Laredo ranks first, with more than 23% of all operations carried out by all customs and contributes more than 16% of the VAT collection for foreign trade operations throughout the country as of December 2022.

Regarding the results of the year 2022, in the annual cumulative count, there were 2,079,785 crossings. The following graph shows the crossings made during the period from 2020 to 2022.

INFRASTRUCTURE

In terms of infrastructure, the World Trade Bridge has the widest installed capacity of any customs facility in the country for customs clearance of goods:

It features a fiscal corridor with:

- 5 lanes for export access and 2 for import access.
- 19 modules for automated selection for import.
- 13 modules for automated selection for export, 10 for regular load and 3 for FAST.
- An import platform with a capacity of
- 108 docks for loading and unloading of goods.
- An export platform with a capacity of
- 62 docks for loading and unloading of goods.
- 2 high-tech stationary X-ray machines for import.
- 1 mobile X-ray machine (ZBV type).
- 5 canine sensors.
- Offices adjacent to the international bridge for authorities such as SENASICA, SAGARPA, PROFEPA, and SEMARNAT.
- Operation of the MATCE System for risk analysis.
- Equipment for detection of synthetic drugs such as PHAZIR.
- 1 railway crossing with a commercial exchange of approximately 2,100 wagons daily.
- Secure station for certified truck crossings.

It is important to note that due to the support of high-tech equipment for customs recognition purposes, the percentage of physical and documentary inspections has been reduced from 10% to 5% of total load.

WORLD TRADE BRIDGE SERVICES

Operating Service Hours The bridge has the broadest operating hours among the 49 customs facilities in the country, providing greater competitiveness in service, as follows:

Import: Monday to Friday from 8:00 AM to 12:00 AM, Saturday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM, and Sunday from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM.

Export: Monday to Friday from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM, Saturday from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM, and Sunday from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Goods Authorizations (Annex 21 of the *RGCE) Definitive import regime, personal or in a bonded warehouse:

- Radioactive and nuclear products.
- Chemical precursors (except section 2939.42.01)
- •Cigarettes and tobacco products (definitive import or fiscal warehouse deposit for general warehouses)
- •Alcoholic beverages.

•Mineral fuels, mineral oils, and products of their distillation; bituminous materials; mineral waxes, etc.

•Used vehicles.

Definitive export regime:

Tequila. Radioactive and nuclear products. Maneuvering Companies: There are 3 maneuvering companies to support the maneuver of loading and unloading of goods.

Authorization for the introduction or extraction of goods from national territory through pipes, ducts, cables, or other means capable of conveying them.

Largest Customs Agents Association in the Country and Transport Lines: There is a total of more than 450 customs agencies between Nuevo Laredo and Laredo, Texas, and over 520 transport lines, emphasizing the city's capacity to support foreign trade.

Extensive Staffing: It has the largest staff among the 49 customs facilities in the country, with approximately 400 personnel.

Joint Clearance: Due to agreements between both countries, it has the option of joint clearance between tax administration secretary (*SAT) and Customs and Border Protection (CBP), significantly reducing processing times for goods at this international crossing.

Sectors Operating Through the Customs In terms of the number of operations carried out from January to September 2019, the primary sector for both import and export is the manufacturing of other parts for motor vehicles.

INTERNATIONAL TRADE SERVICES

International Airports: The region has 2 international airports, one in each country. It is noteworthy that Laredo, Texas, international airport has binational authorization to operate under the "joint clearance" scheme. This allows inspections of goods leaving the United States for Mexico to 8 authorized airports in the Mexican Republic without requiring these goods to be reinspected upon arrival at the Mexican airport.

Railway: It provides import and export services 24 hours a day from Monday to Sunday and has authorization for international crews, gamma-ray, and X-ray equipment. It handles 50% of the total import and export railcars in Mexico. It is worth highlighting the recent acquisition of presidential approval by the transportation operating company for the construction of a second railway bridge, which will double the operational capacity of the port.

Fiscalized Areas: Additionally, it has the services of fiscalized areas adjacent to the bridge perimeter, which are described below.

•Nuevo Laredo Phytosanitary and Customs Inspection, S.A. de C.V.

CIITEV (Temporary Importation and Entry Center for Vehicles): This center is the largest and has the highest capacity for service in Mexico, primarily operated by Banjercito under the supervision of Mexican customs authorities. Other authorities, such as customs and the National Institute of Migration, also concentrate here to serve tourists and nationals.

The purpose of CIITEV is to grant temporary import permits for foreign-origin vehicles for their circulation in Mexican territory. Additionally, it provides personal permits to nationals and foreigners regarding the time they can legally stay in Mexico. It is worth noting that, through the Nuevo Laredo international crossing, CIITEV issues permits for 25% of foreign-origin vehicles entering Mexico.

The World Trade Bridge at the Nuevo Laredo customs has a fiscal corridor of 5 kilometers for trucks involved in export operations to the USA. It also has 3 fixed gamma-ray machines for non-intrusive inspection of import and export goods.


"Los Laredos" is a thriving region for Mexico's foreign trade with the world, primarily with the United States and Canada.

The advantage of its excellent and strategic geographical location is complemented by the experience, talent, capacity, and professionalism of those involved in the customs and transportation sectors on both sides of the Rio Bravo.

The secure and efficient flow of goods in both directions makes this vibrant community a preferred hub for importers and exporters from Mexico and around the world.

In 2022, concerning international trade between these two countries, the customs of Laredo, Texas, operated 291.7 billion dollars, which is equivalent to a 20.18% increase compared to 2021. The installed capacity for the crossing of trucks through the international bridges of the World Trade and Railroad, as well as the Colombia Bridge, ensures present and future competitiveness that is hardly matched by any other shared border between Mexico and the United States.


The synergy among customs experts, transportation professionals, logistics operators, authorities, and public servants from both countries represents the main strength of foreign trade passing through "Los Laredos."




U.S.-Mexico Trade (Port of Laredo), 2014-2022


IMPORT AND EXPORT OPERATIONS THROUGH NUEVO LAREDO MEASURED IN CUSTOMS DOCUMENTS

Nuevo Laredo, located in the northeast of Mexico, has become the most important customs point in America. This city is crucial in international trade between Mexico and the United States due to its strategic location on the border between both countries.


The exports and imports of goods and merchandise through this customs are vital for the economies of both countries, and its role has more crucial after become even the implementation of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and its successor, the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA). In summary, Nuevo Laredo is a focal point for international trade, hence its significance as the most important Customs and Logistics Platform in America.

In 2022, more than 20 million foreign trade operations were recorded in Mexico, of which Nuevo Laredo accounts for **24%** of them. Regarding the collection of VAT on foreign trade, just over **16% is carried out through Nuevo Laredo.**

As for as operations accounting in customs documents, more than 2.4 million crossed through Nuevo Laredo in 2022, representing an increase of almost 5% compared to 2021.

This is due to the geographical location that allows the transfer of goods developed by the manufacturing industry to various destinations with competitive costs. Learn about the benefits of this thriving border region.

INDUSTRIAL SECTOR AND ITS IMPORTANCE

The region of Los Laredos, encompassing the city of Laredo, Texas in the United States, and Nuevo Laredo, Tamaulipas in Mexico, is a key hub for manufacturing and logistics in North America. The industrial sector of Los Dos Laredos has been fundamental for the regional and national economy, creating jobs and attracting foreign direct investment. The geographical proximity of the two cities, along with the logistical infrastructure of roads, railways, and ports, enables an integrated supply chain that facilitates the production and distribution of goods at both national and international levels.

The industrial sector of Los Laredos has specialized in the production of a wide range of manufactured goods, from textiles and electronics to heavy machinery and construction materials. The presence of transnational and national companies in the region has allowed the transfer of technology and specialized knowledge, enhancing the competitiveness of the sector. Additionally, collaboration between businesses and the governments of both cities has led to the implementation of public policies promoting investment and sustainable development in the region. In summary, the industrial sector of Los Dos Laredos is a key engine of the regional and national economy, driving growth and competitiveness in the area.

Manufacturing Industry Figures

According to figures from INEGI, in the city of Nuevo Laredo, there are a total of 779 economic units in the manufacturing industries sector. Regarding IMSS data, as of December 2022, the manufacturing industry generates approximately 37,999 jobs.

It is important to note that the manufacturing industry accounts for 44% of the Total Gross Production recorded in Nuevo Laredo, according to data from economic censuses conducted by INEGI and projections made by the ICCE of Nuevo Laredo, demonstrating the importance of this economic sector. Los Laredos Region also demonstrates strength in the industrial sector, specifically in Nuevo Laredo, where the presence of Index is notable. Index is a private association of Maquiladora companies that has provided specific and specialized representation for its affiliates since 2005. Since its foundation, Index has been incorporated into the **Consejo Nacional de la Industria de la Transformación (Index)**, a representative body at the national level.


This association has completed 16 years in this border region and represents large, nationally and internationally recognized firms such as MODINE, APTIV, CATERPILLAR, Rheem, among others.

Currently, Index represents **95% of the total maquilas** established in Nuevo Laredo and **94% of the industry's employment,** generating more than **30,000 direct jobs.**

In the city of Nuevo Laredo **over 125,000 people** depend on the industry, making it one of the most important sectors today.






NUEVO LAREDO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

During the year 2022, Nuevo Laredo Airport recorded a very significant increase of **129% in airport usage** compared to the year 2021, positioning **us as the airport with the highest growth within the ASA network**. This growth is largely attributed to the arrival of new airlines in our city, which has strengthened the connectivity of Nuevo Laredo. The increase in flight options has facilitated business travel and the mobility of individuals, thus promoting trade and tourism in our region.

HUNTING TOURISM

HUNTING TOURISM OF "LOS LAREDOS"

"Los Laredos" is recognized for its diversified livestock activity, in addition to being the natural habitat of the White-Tailed Deer. This activity has been one of the attractions for local and foreign hunters, who actively participate in the season.

HUNTING TOURISM AND LIVESTOCK IN "LOS LAREDOS"

In Mexico, the practice of sport hunting, globally recognized as cinegetic tourism, is only justified and indeed legally authorized when there are surpluses in wild animal populations that can be sustainably harvested in their natural habitats through sport hunting.

"Los Laredos" is renowned for its diversified livestock activity and is distinguished as the natural habitat of the Texas White-Tailed Deer. Since the 1970s, some ranchers in our region began leasing their ranches for responsible deer hunting, helping with their own expenses, reducing the burden of cattle and goats, achieving better grasslands and natural herbs to better feed their livestock and various native wildlife species.

The conservation efforts of various cinegetic species by the region's ranchers have had a positive impact on ecosystem restoration. Conservation initiatives, reduced poaching, pest control, as well as soil improvement and water capture practices, have led to an increase in populations of cinegetic species such as deer, collared peccaries (wild boars), pumas, bobcats, coyotes, white-winged doves, rabbits, mourning doves, and quails, as well as other species of fauna and flora. For ranchers, coexistence between domestic and wild species is possible, as sustainable management practices make wildlife an alternative source of income for the Mexican countryside. Towards the end of November and until early February each year, trucks can be seen parading on nearby roads heading to the ranches in our region. It is estimated that each hunter contributes an economic impact of around \$4,500.00 dollars, spent on gas stations, supermarkets, tire shops, guide fees, ranch rentals, feed stores, etc. In addition to the main hunting trophy, such as the White-Tailed Deer, other hunting activities include coyotes, collared peccaries (javelinas), European wild boars, rabbits, white-winged doves, quails, and ducks, always respecting the current official hunting calendar.



In the National Committee for Diversified Livestock Production System, the following value chains were identified based on the sustainable management and utilization, both extractive and non-extractive, of wildlife populations and their habitats:

•Sport Hunting (hunting activity).

- •Wild Game Meat.
- •Markets for Ornamental Plants and Pets.
- •Alternative Tourism.
- •Environmental Services.
- •Insects and other arthropods for human consumption.
- •Parts and derivatives of wildlife.

For the 2022-2023 hunting season, around **3,400** white-tailed deer hunters were registered in this region, averaging **56% national hunters and 44% foreign hunters, with 4,307 tags issued.**

It is important to note that in the same season, the utilization of other species such as white-winged doves, ducks, teals, as well as collared peccaries, among others, was also recorded. According to annual field statistics in 35% of all hunting ranches owned by ANGADI Fauna Breeders members that provide services for Texan white-tailed deer sport hunting, 85% of participating hunters achieve success in their hunts, and 80% of these hunters are satisfied with the trophy obtained.

TOURIST ATTRACTIONS IN "LOS LAREDOS"

Visit the historic downtowns of Laredo and Nuevo Laredo, and don't miss a walk through the first blocks of both Laredos, learning about their history through the oldest places, enjoying their sunsets and cultural events in different family leisure spots, as well as a wide variety of establishments in a bazaar atmosphere, where you can acquire different products.

Juárez Square

Founding square that houses the monument to Santiago M. Belden. This was the first square built as such in our city, since the establishment of the old Villa de Nuevo Laredo.

Miguel Hidalgo Square

Built in 1895, originally called Plaza de la Guardia Nacional. On July 30 of that same year, to commemorate the death anniversary of the Father of the Nation, its name was changed to "Plaza Hidalgo."

Culture Square

This square is integrated into the architectural complex of the municipal presidency. It has a quarry fountain, called "Fuente del Poeta," as its central element.

Ignacio Zaragoza Square

This beautiful and modern square is located in front of the Cathedral of the Espíritu Santo on Paseo Colón Avenue, in the Longoria neighborhood.

The Public Clock

Located in Hidalgo Square, this clock was built in 1926 and inaugurated in September of the same year. It is a tower clad in white quarry, approximately 15 meters high, including the bell tower on a square base in four steps.

Municipal Presidency

Building that houses the municipal presidency, built in the early 80s in a neocolonial style and remodeled in 2004.

Simón Bolívar Square

One of the largest and most emblematic squares in the city, it houses the monument to Simón Bolívar. In this square, 19 flags from different countries symbolizing international unity are displayed.



Longoria Bank

Neoclassical building of marble and granite, constructed and operated with local capital towards the end of the 1920s.

Church of the Santo Niño de Atocha

Religious building for Catholic worship built in 1851. It was designed by the renowned architect Mateo Mattei.

Cathedral of the Espíritu Santo

The Cathedral of the Holy Spirit is the seat of the Diocese of Nuevo Laredo. It is located on Paseo Colón Avenue in Nuevo Laredo.

Floral Clock


Located in Ignacio Zaragoza Square, in front of the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit. It is an attraction for passersby who observe it adorned with flowers and seasonal plants.

Cultural Space of the Antigual Aduana (Sala Sergio Peña)

General Archive of the Municipality of Nuevo Laredo, Tamps. "Juan E. Richer"

The old railway station was built in 1918 after being burned down during the revolutionary period. After a restoration process, the building was repurposed in 2003 to house the General Archive of the Municipality.


It has a permanent exhibition where you can take a chronological journey through the natural history of the region, replicas of fossils, flora, fauna, and geography. Located within the Cultural Center.



Later, in September 1977, it "Laredo State University." became On September 1, 1989, it joined the Texas A&M system and was subsequently designated as Texas A&M International University, becoming the only university in this system with an international focus.

In the fall of 1995, the 74th Texas Legislature approved the expansion of study programs to four years, authorizing TAMIU to develop joint degree programs with Mexican and Canadian institutions. higher education Additional authorizations allowed for the creation of the current Doctorate in International Business program, and the establishment of a new doctorate in criminal justice is expected in the near future.

Recognitions
